Road Safety Education - Week 1 Task (Child Cycle Safety)

- During the month of June, there will be a weekly task designed for you to work alongside and complete with your child/children in relation to a key road safety issue:
- This week the focus is on cycle helmets please ensure your child wears a cycle helmet every time they are riding their bicycle and that it is properly fitted and adjusted to reduce the impact of a fall or collision at slow speed. Three simple tests to check that the helmet fits:

Test 1 -

Open your mouth wide

– does your helmet pull
down on your head? If not,
tighten the chin strap a bit
more.

Test 2 -

Can you rock your helmet back more than two fingers above your eyebrows? If yes, unbuckle and shorten the front strap by moving the slider forward. Buckle, retighten the chin strap, and test again.

Test 3 -

Can you rock your helmet forward over your eyes? If it does, unbuckle and tighten the back strap by moving the slider back towards the ear. Buckle, retighten the chin strap, and test again.
