School Car Park SLOTS

Thank you for your continued patience particularly on a Friday. We realise it is slower at the moment due to young children still getting used to the system.

We would ask that all pupils are ready to exit their cars with coats and bags ready to go. The mornings can be very busy and we wish to encourage a constant flow in and out of the car park.

ALL PUPILS are now expected to use the system. We would ask that you stick to your time slots to avoid confusion and to maintain a constant flow of traffic particularly when collecting. At times with forgotten bags etc classes may be out just after their slot. Please come within your ten-minute time slot. Thank you for continuing to give priority to those exiting the car park.

Contacting school

We would ask at these times for all parents to use our school info account when informing school of information. If you have any queries for our teachers or wish to speak with them, please use our email account to arrange an appointment.

Our school email is <u>info@ampertaineps.maghera.ni.sch.uk</u>. We would ask for your email subject to include the name of the pupil and class.

COVID Guidance update

We are very conscious that COVID numbers across NI are still high so if your child is symptomatic at all, or has been identified as a close contact, please do not send them to school. Isolate them, notify us and book a PCR test immediately.

All arrangements will be kept under review and any changes will be communicated to you as and when appropriate and/or necessary. If you have any other queries or questions please do not hesitate to get in touch.

We thank our parents for their understanding during an ever changing line of guidance from the EA.

Our FIVE steps to follow

- 1. If your child is unwell, please keep him/her at home.
- 2. If your child is unwell in school, he/she will be sent home.
- 3. If you feel that your child MIGHT have Covid-19 symptoms, please do a Lateral Flow Test or book a PCR test. Preference being PCR.
- 4. If your child tests positive for Covid-19, please keep your child at home to isolate.
- 5. If a child or staff member in class tests positive for Covid-19, I will inform parents from that class (and anyone else who may have been close contact). The PHA may contact close contacts but this could take time and may not include your child.

 In this case, it is the RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH PARENT to decide whether to regularly do Lateral Flow Tests with their child, book a PCR test for their child or do nothing.

It is essential that EVERYONE plays a part in keeping themselves and others safe.

School payments

Children should bring payment into school on MONDAY morning.

Payments MUST include correct change and be organised with the school envelope clearly labelled with:

- Nature of payment ie school dinners
- Payment details ie days of the week
- Child's name and class

School envelopes can be purchased at a cost of £2.50.

We are required to deal with all money using appropriate PPE, all money will be removed from the building and banked before a complete clean down of the office area. This is why is it vital that money is received in this way and can ONY be dealt with on a MONDAY morning. We greatly appreciate your assistance in this matter in this unprecedented situation.

School dinners

The children had responded well to the new system in place with those taking dinners increasing as the school term as developed.

We hope you approve of our changes and we look forward to more pupils enjoying the delicious meals. The menu is on our website in the Newsletter section and has been emailed to all who have subscribed to our website.

All money MUST be in an envelope clearly labelled and brought into school on the MONDAY to enable Clare to count and then sanitise the work area. The **EXACT AMOUNT OF MONEY** should be in the envelope.

Recycling @ Ampertaine

At Ampertaine, we pride ourselves on encouraging and observing good environmentally friendly practices. Part of our aim is to <u>reduce</u> the amount of single use plastics. To this end, we would encourage reusable containers for lunches and snacks instead of single use plastics such as sandwich bags, cling wrap, frubes, yoghurt pots, fruit shoots and so on. However, we do realise this is not always practical.

As part of our *recycling* programme therefore, we are very honoured to be in partnership with Vicky Seviour-Crockett in collecting recyclable items to raise money for Kicks Count, the UK's leading baby movement resource and awareness campaign.



We would therefore ask you to be mindful of the packaging you are using, in order to help us out with our green credentials. The Kicks Count campaign can accept the following:

- All brands of biscuit, cake, cracker, cereal bar, rice cakes.
- All brands of crisp, popcorn and pretzels.
- All brands of sweets and chocolate (plastic only).
- All Kinder packaging.
- Bread bags, pancake, soda, crumpet, croissant, rolls, wrap packets, etc.,
- Cheese packaging
- Babybel wax and packaging.
- Pringles tubes and lids.
